Artist Biographies

Sofia Hirsch began violin studies at age four with her mother. Returning to professional music after college, she joined the Vermont Symphony in 2001. She helped create the Music in the Barn series in Richmond, playing in all six concerts in last year's culminating season. She plays in a string trio backing the folk duo Cricket Blue. Most recent projects include playing a solo (and acting!) in *Orpheus in the Underworld* with the Opera Company of Middlebury, and playing viola and singing in Hannah Dennison's Quarry Project in 15 live performances in the Barre Quarry. Sofia resides in South Burlington.

Laura Markowitz, violinist, hails from Pittsburgh, PA and played in the Santiago Philharmonic, the Ohio Chamber Orchestra, and the Florida Orchestra before joining the Vermont Symphony in the early 90's. Besides playing with various local ensembles, Laura loves Irish and Swedish music and leads summer fiddle classes with students in the area. She also plays for English Country Dances and plays viola with the band Cricket Blue. She maintains a private teaching studio in Richmond and lives in Jericho.

Ana Ruesink, violist, enjoys exploring musical styles and traditions. An active freelance musician, she performs with the Vermont Symphony, Dartmouth Symphony, Opera Company of Middlebury, and other regional ensembles. Some of her chamber groups include Impropriety (English country dance music) and Skylark (contemporary Nordic folk tunes). Ana teaches viola at UVM and from her home studio in Burlington's south end.

John Dunlop, cellist, has been performing in the Northeast for over twenty-five years and is principal cellist with the Vermont Symphony and the Opera Company of Middlebury. He has performed as soloist with the VSO, premiering a commissioned concerto in October of 2021. He is cellist with the new music ensemble TURN and the VSO-sponsored Jukebox Quartet. John has composed and recorded soundtracks for short films, including a documentary on childhood hunger in Vermont, where he doubled on guitar and bouzouki. Most recently, he recorded on Cricket Blue's latest album. John teaches privately in Richmond and lives in Jericho.
